

STORY OF THE PHANTOM - Small white rocks with the words "The Phantom", painted in black, began showing up in the summer of 1986. The first one showed up at Bill Barr's Stedman's store. Jim Grieve found one in front of the IGA store and others were at the front doors of Luke's Country Store, Emmerson Insurance, Port Perry Star and more. Then the Phantom went silent for 20 years, until he/she dropped off a letter with a \$100 donation to purchase a brick for the Scugog Arena expansion in November 2006. The Phantom has not been heard of since. To my knowledge there was only one large Phantom rock, which was found in front of the post office - all the others were fist-sized rocks
